April 21, 2019 – The Resurrection – Easter Sunday

First Reading Acts 10:34a, 37-43

St. Peter's first sermon, albeit a largely Lucan composition, is nonetheless a summary of the life and mission of Jesus, with its fitting climax of the resurrection.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

These verses point out what the early Church believed: Jesus fulfilled all the promises made about the Messiah. In the end time, believers will be with Christ in glory.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

All four gospels report that there were women visiting Jesus' tomb who found it empty. The Beloved Disciple, restraining himself from dashing into the tomb, is here so respectful of Peter and makes for a splendid example of Easter faith. His affirmation is the highlight of the visit to the tomb.

Reflection:

With the "beloved disciple" we have been loved with a love that death cannot overcome. We have come to believe in the permanence of that love and trust that, neither sin nor even death, will separate us from it. We believe we are being held fast by that love—we have eternal life now, into death and beyond death.

So we ask ourselves:

- Have I had any recent concrete experience of Christ's love for me?
- How has that affected my outlook in times of loss and disappointment?

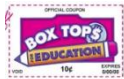
