First Reading: Daniel 12: 1-3

Those whose names are written in the book of life will live forever in light and joy.

Second Reading: Hebrews 10: 11-14, 18

Jesus our great High Priest, sits now in heavenly glory and waits until His enemies are under His feet.

Gospel: Mark 13: 24-32


The key event is Jesus' return, the final proof of God's victory over evil. The fig tree's growth process acts as a warning sign that the event is near.

Reflection:

Our faith invites us to trust that, even amid complete upheaval, God has not abandoned us. "The tribulation" Jesus predicts for his disciples is about to take place for him. When their world collapses with Jesus' death, will they remember and cling to his words and look forward to an entirely new Spring? The same can be asked of us.

So, we ask ourselves:

- As we face our own tribulations can we trust that Jesus' words will not fail us, and that he will be faithful to us?
- How can I be a symbol of Jesus' steadfastness to others in their trials?
