July 3, 2022 – Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 66: 10-14c

The prophet exhorts the people of the new Jerusalem to rejoice. He offers a lovely image of the people as God's children nursing at the breast of a "Mother" Jerusalem.

Second Reading: Galatians 6: 14-18

In his resume, St. Paul boasts only of the Cross and Christ crucified. He expresses his own dependence always on God's grace.

Gospel: Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20 or 10: 1-9

Jesus prepares His future messengers for their mission with wise instructions, including the offering of peace to the people they encounter. He also makes clear that they will meet resistance and even rejection, and how to handle that when it happens.

Reflection:

Disciples have important work to do and we must get about our task. We are to be bearers of peace in a tumultuous, peace-starved world - people who announce God's presence and concern to those who feel cut off from God and on their own. Our message, by our words and actions is, "The kingdom of God is at hand."

So, we ask ourselves:

- To whom am I being sent to bring Jesus' peace-greeting?
- What do I have to let go of – attitude, hesitations, fears, anxieties – so I can mirror the peace
