July 10, 2022 – Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30: 10-14

The law is not something in arcane language that needs outside interpretation. It is something “very near” to one’s heart that only needs carrying out.

Second Reading: Colossians 1: 15-20

Since we were created in Christ, we are empowered to do His will. Love of neighbor is its singular demand and impact.

Gospel: Luke 10: 25-27

The well-known and powerful parable of “The Good Samaritan” offers a great lesson on mercy toward the needy. But there is another point that Jesus made, namely, that a non-Jew who observes the law can be saved.

Reflection:

The Samaritan would have known from his own experience what it felt like to be “beaten up” and left behind. His was a member of a despised group, an outsider to the religious and national thinking of the Jew. This may have stirred him to respond to the victim by the side of the road. He knew what it was like to be victimized.

So, we ask ourselves:

- Can we remember an experience of being left out, treated as an outsider?
- Does that experience make us more aware and sensitive to the plight of outsiders these days? Who are these outsiders?
