July 17, 2022 – Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Genesis 18: 1-10a

Abraham, "our father in faith" graciously hosts three visitors to his encampment. They actually represent the Lord. In accepting the favor, they prophesy that Abraham's wife Sarah, barren up 'til now, will soon bear a son.

Second Reading: Colossians 1: 24-28

Part of the mystery of Christ is that He reaches us ordinarily through one another. Because of his stewardship of Christ, St. Paul rejoices even in his sufferings.

Gospel: Luke 10: 38-42

Martha and Mary host Jesus. He tells them of "the one thing necessary," which is openness to His person and message. He cites Mary to her sister Martha for her having chosen "the better part" while He is present.

Reflection:

There is not just one way of being Jesus' disciples. Nor is one way superior and the other inferior. Instead, we are invited to follow both ways. The challenge is deciding when we are to choose Mary's way and when we are to choose Martha's. As one commentator has said, "The Christian life involves, among other things, a sense of timing."

So, we ask ourselves:

- When does your life resemble Martha's?
- When do you choose to follow Mary's way?
- How balanced in your life are these two ways?
