September 4, 2022 – Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Wisdom 9: 13-18b

This is part of Solomon's prayer in which he acknowledges that all of our deliberations are weak because of our bodily concerns. Therefore, who of us can really know the Lord's ways?

Second Reading: Philemon: 9-10, 12-17

Paul asserts that Philemon's slave Onesimus has become like a son to him. Now that he is a Christian, he will be coming back to his owner a better person, a true disciple of the Lord and one who forgives injuries.

Gospel: Luke 14: 25-33


This section embraces Luke's conditions for being a disciple. A person must necessarily consider those before taking any action. Above all, a true disciple must follow through on his/her resolve to the end.

Reflection:

Jesus uses stark language today to make a point. There is no putting off decisions we must make and changes we have not yet gotten around to. We must carefully think out and weigh: how are to respond to Jesus today? What is very clear from the gospel is that it costs to serve completely and utterly this Christ we call Lord.

So, we ask ourselves:

- What decisions have we been putting off that we know Christ is asking us to make?
- What will be the costs for us if we make these decisions?

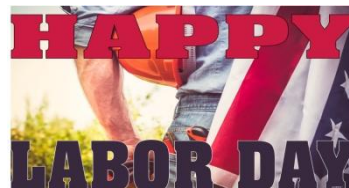
