September 18, 2022 – Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Amos 8: 4-7

The prophet condemns the hypocrites who only observe the Sabbath by not working on the day of the new moon, but quickly plot to cheat the poor people by their clever use of various weights.

Second Reading: I Timothy 2: 1-8

Paul urges the community to pray for the emperor and other civil authorities to prove to their critics that they are not anti-government. The one true God desires that all human beings be saved.

Gospel: Luke 16: 1-13, or 16: 10-13


The shrewd steward here is an embezzler who uses his soon to be lost position to prepare for his future. He is an example of how people who live by the present day culture at least have enthusiasm for their work. Jesus contrasts this with the dull response to God's kingdom by some of His own disciples, the so-called "sons of light."

Reflection:

Jesus calls us to look at money and possessions not as ends in themselves, but as instruments we can use to further God's vision for ourselves and the world. The material things I have are like a trust I do not possess for my own sake, but as part of God's plan for me, as a disciple of Jesus, in the world.

So, we ask ourselves:

- Have I so made money and career so much a part of my life that I have little time for God?
- How am I using my talents and possessions to further the God's reign of love and justice?
