February 11, 2024 - Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Leviticus 13: 1-2, 44-46

Lepers in those ancient days had to live not only with physical pain but also with psychological pain from the several laws regarding them. In addition to forced separation from the community, they were obliged to cry out "Unclean!" whenever they neared healthy people.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10; 31-11:1

Paul urges his flock to act like Christ as healers and at the same time to be compassionate toward all whom they may encounter.

Gospel: Mark 1: 40-45

With a loving and tender touch, disregarding strict laws against any kind of physical contact with lepers, Jesus touches a man with the disease and heals him. He then orders the man to follow the law by showing himself to a priest who would declare him "clean."

Reflection:

Who are we at this Eucharist today? We are a community of people always in need of cleansing; always stretching out our hands saying to Jesus, "If you want, you can make us clean." And Jesus responds quickly and with compassion, as he did for the leper, "Of course I want to, be clean."

So we ask ourselves:

- Who are the modern "lepers" in our world, people shunned for no fault of their own?
- Is there someone, neglected by others, that I need to stretch out my hand to?

Dear Parishioners of Presentation BVM,

In recent months, members of the Pres community have seen a great need in the parish for certain families and individuals facing economic hardship. In some instances, these individuals have sought the parish's help for basic necessities like groceries. With the hope of meeting this present need, Fr. Harrison and parishioners would like to begin a new collection effort as we enter into the 2024 Lenten season. Beginning on the first Sunday of Lent, we ask parishioners to consider making a gift card purchase(s) from a local supermarket as an additional part of their parish contributions. These gift cards would be set aside for anyone facing food insecurity due to an economic hardship. How do I participate in this effort?

- Purchase a supermarket gift card next time you make a trip for groceries. The gift card can be from any supermarket! Examples include Shoprite, Acme, or Giant. You may also purchase a gift card through the parish's Scrip Program. The Scrip Office is open on Sundays! Review the Scrip Program schedule included in this bulletin for more details.
- 2. Place your purchased gift card in the collections box located in the Church vestibule when you attend Mass.
- 3. Repeat as often as you feel called to do so.
- 4. We suggest a minimum amount of \$25 per gift card donation

A person who finds themself in need should not feel ashamed to seek support during a trying time in life. The Presentation BVM community seeks to be a refuge for those suffering from any kind of material hardship, especially food insecurity. This is an especially timely opportunity for those of us with means as we enter into the Lenten season. It is a time that calls us to a spirit of repentance and renewal, of sacrifice and almsgiving, for the good of ourselves and our neighbor. We ask that you prayerfully consider participating in this collection effort as we strive to embrace the Lord Jesus in each and every member of our community, especially those in greatest need.

How can I benefit from this collection effort if I am in need of assistance?

You may request a gift card(s) by doing one of the following:

- Approach Fr. Harrison after a scheduled Mass and let him know that you are in need of support from this effort.
- Call or visit the Rectory during scheduled office hours noted in this bulletin to request support and pick up a gift card.

Anyone that requests assistance from this new collection will not be turned down so long as gift cards are available for distribution. Fr. Harrison will determine the amount of the gift card(s) to be distributed based on gift card availability and individual need. May God bless you and may the Holy Spirit guide you!



Fast & Abstinence Obligations during Lent

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.


