March 17, 2024 - Fifth Sunday of Lent

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

This short oracle has been called "one of the most profound and moving passages in the entire Bible." Note the use of the words "new Covenant." It is the only time they are used in the entire Old Testament.

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:7-9

The author considers that Jesus' ability to sympathize with sinners arises from the fact that He knew temptation. His obedience led to His priestly consecration.

Gospel: John 12: 20-33

Some Greeks come to see Jesus. He tells Andrew and Philip that "when a grain of wheat dies it produces much fruit." This is a direct reference to His upcoming passion and death.

Reflection:

Jesus and his disciples hadn't preached to these Greeks. They didn't proselytize them, they came of their own free will. What was the attraction? They and we are attracted by the One who, in his hour, is a completely faithful servant to God; who shows total generosity, willing to give up everything for us, without holding back anything in reserve.

So we ask ourselves:

- How have we benefited from the sacrifices others have made on our behalf?
- What sacrifices are we being asked to make for the well being of others?
- How have we experienced the fruits of these sacrifices in our own lives?

This is an especially timely opportunity for those of us with means as we enter into the Lenten season. Fast & Abstinence Obligations during Lent

Friday 🕥 Fasting

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together

are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.


