## April 21, 2024 - 4th Sunday of Easter

## First Reading: Acts 4: 8-12

Peter's first discourse is more like an "apologia" than a sermon. In it. Peter answers the Sanhedrin's question directly.

## Second Reading: 1 John 3: 1-2

By way of the Paschal mystery, we have truly become the children of God.

## Gospel: John 10: 11-18

In this section, "good" really means "noble" or "ideal", and not just "good at" something or other. Unlike bad shepherds, who allow the sheep to be eaten by wolves, Jesus lays down His life for His sheep.

## Reflection:

There are a lot of voices out there that can only distract and scatter us. Perhaps we've paid too much attention to them at times in our lives. Through hard experience we have learned that they don't have our best interests at heart and if we listen to them we are scattered. But the voice of the Shepherd, Jesus tells us, wants to gather us. His voice can help us keep our wits about us in an often misquided world.

#### So we ask ourselves:

- Can I name the "false shepherds" I have listened to? How did they mislead me?
- Where and how do I listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd?

Now, Jesus did something that ordinary shepherd would not do.




an ordinary shepherd would not do. Besides guiding and protecting us, He died to save us! Because He died for our sins, all of His sheep can now go to Heaven where they will be
